NORTHBOUND SR 436 TO EASTBOUND SR 528 RAMP ENTRANCE MOVES QUARTER MILE EARLIER!

(Orange County, FL) — The [Central Florida Expressway Authority](http://www.CFXway.com) (CFX) is scheduled to open a new entrance for the ramp from northbound SR 436/Semoran Boulevard to eastbound SR 528/Beachline Expressway (Exit 1A) on Saturday, March 20. Drivers need to be aware that this new ramp entrance is located nearly a quarter mile south of the old ramp entrance.

Drivers will want to make sure they follow the signs for the new ramp entrance and not rely on their GPS mapping systems. If you miss the new ramp entrance, just continue north on SR 436 to TG Lee Boulevard where you can carefully make a U-turn to return to eastbound SR 528 via southbound SR 436.

Due to weather and other unforeseen circumstances, this date could be adjusted.

This is part of CFX's signature \$118 million SR 528/SR 436 interchange improvement project that will improve traffic flow from the north into the Orlando International Airport (OIA). This includes transforming the existing loop ramps (from southbound SR 436 to eastbound SR 528 and from northbound SR 436 to SR 528) into direct flyover connections.

The project also will add an additional travel lane in each direction of SR 528 (Beachline Expressway) between Conway Road and Goldenrod Road to ease congestion at this busy interchange.
